School Enrollment



Information for reapplying for admission for
the 2018-2019 school year will be sent home
to the oldest child in each family on **01/08/18**.

Financial aid information will also be
included. If you have younger children
who will be entering Kindergarten, Tiny Eagles, or Pre-K,
please be sure to include them on the application. If you
do not receive these forms please call Mrs. DW for
assistance.

After in-house reapplication is completed, open
enrollment will be held on Wednesday, February 7, 2018
for families on the waiting list and then the general public
if there are any other openings available. It is extremely
important for families to return their forms and application
fee of \$50 on a timely basis.

Every family who returns their completed
application by **2/5/18** will be eligible for a scholarship
drawing. Two \$500 scholarships will be awarded. This
drawing will take place at the **March 8, 2018 PTA
Meeting**. Thank you so very much for your cooperation
and assistance.

For our 18/19 financial aid assessment process,
we are partnering with FACTS Grant Aid Assessment to
conduct the financial need analysis and verification for
schools of our diocese. All Financial Aid applications
must be submitted online by **2/15/18**. Directions will be
included in the re-enrollment packets. Mrs. Medina, our
finance manager, is willing to assist parents with this

News from the Health Office



Protect your child against Flu. It is important to get a flu vaccine for you and your child each year.

Steps to help prevent the spread of germs include:

- Wash hands often with soap & water, or an alcohol-based hand rub
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. Germs spread this way.
- If someone in the household is sick, try to keep them in a separate room from others, if possible.
- Keep toys & surfaces in the bedroom, bathroom, and kitchen clean by using a household disinfectant.

Can my child go to school or day care if he or she is sick? Your child should stay home to rest and to avoid spreading their illness to other children or caregivers. Keep your child home from school for **at least 24 hours after their fever is gone, with no medication.** A fever is defined as 100°F or higher.

Please inform Mrs. DW or Mrs. Nicoletti when your child has been diagnosed with a communicable disease. Examples would be Strep, Chicken Pox, Fifth Disease, Whooping Cough, etc.

- Please continue to save the **Big G Box Tops**. Look for the "Big G Box Tops for Education" logo on the box tops; send in only the half with this logo. The Big G Box Tops for Education program ends on **March 1, 2018 for this school year.**
- Childcare tax statements for tax year 2017 will be mailed by January 31, 2018. All payments received by the end of the year will be included in the calculation of the tax statement.
